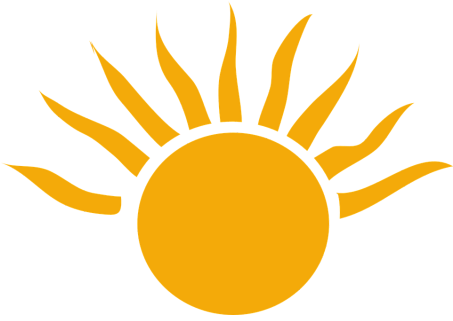

25. Draw and label a map of your neighborhood.
26. Make at least 10 words out of "VACATION".
27. Read a story aloud to your pet or stuffed animal.
28. Build something and tell someone all about it.
29. Find a scripture passage to inspire you, copy it down.
